Free Internet Search

The internet often delivers results based on where users live and what they've looked up in the past.

Although content is free with internet access, anyone can publish inaccurate information on the web whenever they want. No one is policing the internet.

Free search doesn't allow users to limit searches to full text, articles with images, etc.

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Users can view, save, print, email or export citations for chosen articles, in many different formats, directly from the database.

EBSCO Discovery Service (EDS),
EBSCOhost and Explora (EBSCO's
dedicated interface for schools and
public libraries) each offer users
a single search box for easy content
retrieval. Explora also includes
browseable topic categories. Both
EDS and Explora feature topic
overviews that provide a starting
place for research.

EBSCO resources are compliant with Section 508 Standards, which means they are accessible to people with disabilities. Text-to-speech for HTML articles also assists struggling readers, auditory learners and those developing English-language proficiency.

Compliant with the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA), meaning EBSCO does not ask for or require personal information to access its databases.
