Nursing Skills Implementing Airborne Isolation Precautions

Procedure

PROCEDURE STEPS

- 1. Place or verify that the patient has been placed in an $AIIR^3$
- 2. If the patient is not in an AIIR, arrange transfer to an AIIR as soon as possible
- 3. If an AIIR is not available, place the patient in a private room with the door closed to reduce the likelihood of airborne transmission until the patient can be transferred to a facility with appropriate air handling and ventilation capacity³
- 4. In a pandemic, patients with known or suspected disease, such as COVID-19, should be cared for in a single room with door closed. AIIR would be reserved for patients undergoing aerosol-generating procedures⁸
- 5. Collaborate with appropriate healthcare personnel to determine whether or not cohorting patients with same disease is possible and desirable
- 6. Ensure patient room is stocked appropriately with isolation supplies, and signage is posted to notify staff and visitors.
 - 1. Place a sign at the entrance to the patient's room and at strategic places in the patient's room to notify all staff members and visitors that airborne precautions are being observed

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2. Verify that the anteroom to the AIIR is stocked with PPE, including <u>N95 respirators</u> for facility personnel and surgical or isolation masks for the patient and visitors

- 3. If the AIIR does not have an anteroom, bring an isolation cart stocked with the necessary PPE to just outside the entrance to the patient's room
- 4. Verify that hand washing supplies or an alcohol-based hand sanitizer are within easy access to the cart or caddy and an appropriate trash receptacle is available for discarded respirators and surgical masks
- 5. Include a notice that the cart contains latex-based items because family members and visitors may be using the items in the cart, if applicable
- 7. Properly <u>don</u> respirator⁴
- 8. Perform seal check of respirator
- 9. Don other PPE as appropriate⁴
- 10. Establish privacy by closing the door to the patient's room and/or drawing the curtain surrounding the patient's bed
- 11. Keep the door to the AIIR closed when not required for entry and exit
- 12. Handle linens with minimal agitation to reduce the risk for inadvertent dispersal of pathogens
- 13. Remove the respirator by first bringing the lower elastic strap up and over the head, and then bring the upper elastic strap up and over the head
- 14. Remove the facepiece from over the nose and mouth
- 15. Handle the respirator only by the elastic straps
- 16. Do not touch the facepiece to avoid contaminating the hands
- 17. Either discard the respirator or save for <u>reuse</u> by placing in a breathable container or on a designated hook labeled with the name of the clinician using the respirator. <u>More about discarding the respirator</u>

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
