





End the Couch Quest for InformationFind What You Really Need

The Couch Quest

Searching the web for information to complete a school project is like reaching into the cushions of your couch to find the missing TV remote. For every crumpled dollar bill, cell phone charger or working pen you find, you may also unearth stale pizza crusts, broken pencils, popcorn kernels, and jelly beans of unknown origin. Likewise, searching the web brings back mountains of spam, advertisements, and results from sources just as questionable as those jelly beans.





How does EBSCO Discovery Service help students?

Kevin needs to write an essay on the environmental impact of upgrading your cell phone every year. He also wants to catch the tip-off of the NCAA Championship game at 8 p.m. His teacher says he needs to use journal articles and newspaper stories; however, when he searches "electronic waste" on the internet, all he finds are ads for solid waste firms, an announcement about a recycling summit, and opinion pieces on electronic waste management. He'll never find what he needs in time to watch the game.

So Kevin tries *EBSCO Discovery Service*. He enters "electronic waste" in the search box and finds useful background information in a Research Starter at the top of the results list. In addition to giving him a citable, authoritative summary article on the topic, the Research Starter also includes links to related topics and a detailed bibliography.

To make his work even faster, all of the resources he finds contain citation information that he can use to build his list of references.
