Find your best shot setup, lighting, and check your sound.


Wear something you love!

Look directly into the camera, not at yourself on screen. Introduce yourself and state what you'll be doing in the livestream. Do this every 5-10 minutes depending on the length.

You don't have to be perfect. There's no right or wrong length.




Facebook Live



- Click "choose live" inside status.
- Description, audience, filter, "start live video."
- Click "finish" then share the post to your feed.



Instagram Live



- Tap the camera icon or swipe right or tap to add to your story.
- Badge indicates you are live and your story will be first in the que.



Save to highlights if you want to save it forever.



Twitter Live



- Tap the camera icon and scroll over to "live."
- You can add a description.
- You can invite guests *before* you live. Tap "invite guests" to select or search for people to join your broadcast.
- Tap "Go Live."



Promotion is important. Tell people you'll go live before you go live.
